Join distinguished historian **A. Wilson Greene** as we spend three days covering the Confederate victory at Chickamauga and the Union triumph at Chattanooga.

With historian A. Wilson Greene we'll make our initial interpretive stops along West Chickamauga Creek at Reed's and Alexander's Bridges. From there we will examine the opening action between Bushrod Johnson's division and Col. John Wilder's mounted infantry. In the afternoon our attention will shift to the northern end of the battlefield and the combat along the Brotherton Road.

We will devote the morning to the sites associated with the great Confederate attack led by Gen. Breckinridge and General Cleburne against Snodgrass hill. In the afternoon we will examine the scene of Longstreet's assault spearheaded by John Bell Hood. We'll finish the day walking along Horseshoe Ridge.

On our final day with A. Wilson Greene we'll cover the dramatic action regarding the Battles of Lookout Mountain and Missionary Ridge. In the afternoon we will focus on W. T. Sherman's attack at Tunnel Hill.

*Peninsula Campaign & Seven Days' Battles
Friday - Sunday
October 2-4 2020*

On Friday with **John Quarstein** we will cover the Peninsula Campaign and visit the *U.S.S. Monitor*. **Jeff Wert** will lead us on Saturday as we trace Stuart's ride. On Sunday **R.E.L. Krick** will take us from Beaver Dam Creek, to Gaines' Mill, Savage's Station, White Oak Swamp, Glendale and Malvern Hill.

On Friday with **John Quarstein** we will cover the Battles of Lee's Mill, Dam No. 1, Williamsburg and other sites associated with McClellan's Peninsula Campaign. In addition, we will visit the U.S.S. Monitor at the Mariner's Museum in Newport News.

Saturday with noted historian **Jeff Wert** we will make stops at Eltham's Landing and Seven Pines before embarking to retrace the route of Jeb Stuart's famous ride around the Army of the Potomac.

Finally on Sunday with **Bob Krick** we will cover the Seven Days' battles focusing on Beaver Dam Creek, Gaines' Mill, Frayser's Farm and Malvern Hill. In addition we'll make stops at White Oak bridge and Savage's Station, sight of the Union hospital. This is a comprehensive tour of the Union attempt to seize Richmond in 1862 and the emergence of R.E. Lee to stop the Yankees at the Gates of Richmond.

*Tennessee Winter
Fort Donelson, Franklin & the
Battle of Stones River
Friday - Sunday
October 16-18 2020*

Join **Larry Daniel, Thomas Cartwright** and **David Ward** for this tour of three winter battles in Tennessee which determined the fate of the Confederacy.

Our first day with **David Ward** will start at the Fort Donelson visitor's center. We'll afford coverage to C. F. Smith's attack on February 13 and also make several stops to examine the Confederate breakout attempt on February 15. Stops will also be made at the Dover Hotel, National Cemetery and Fort Heiman.

With tour guide **Larry Daniel** we will examine the battlefield of Stones River. Most of the stops touring Stones River will be outside of the small National Military Park. We will view Rosecrans' and Bragg's headquarters sites, Hazen Brigade monument, Round Forest, McFadden's Ford, Fortress Rosecrans, National Cemetery, Evergreen (Confederate) Cemetery and the Rutherford County Court House.

Our final day with **Thomas Cartwright** will be devoted to **John Bell Hood's** 1864 Tennessee campaign which featured the dramatic battle of Franklin. Major tour stops will be Winstead Hill, Carnton and the McGavock cemetery.

*High Tide at Gettysburg
Day 3 & Lee's Retreat
Friday – Sunday
October 9-11 2020*

Join distinguished historians **Jeff Wert**, **Jim Hessler** and **Eric Wittenberg** as we examine in detail the exciting events of July 3rd and Lee's retreat from Gettysburg.

This tour will feature cavalry action at Fairfield, East Cavalry field as well as Farnsworth's charge. We will also walk Pickett's assault.

On Friday with Eric Wittenberg we will spend the day following the retreat of the Army of Northern Virginia from Gettysburg. We will make stops at Monterey Gap battlefield, stop at the battlefield of Funkstown and finish the day with stops at Falling Waters and Williamsport.

On Saturday with Jeff Wert we will cover a host of cavalry actions which often go unnoticed. We will visit the battle of Fairfield, the dramatic scene at East Cavalry field and the site of Farnsworth's charge. In addition we will also visit the Gettysburg cyclorama.

Finally with Jim Hessler we will visit an obscure site known as the Lost Avenue near Rock Creek. We will also cover the action at Culp's Hill and walk Pickett's charge in the afternoon.

John Quarstein is an expert on the U.S.S. Monitor.

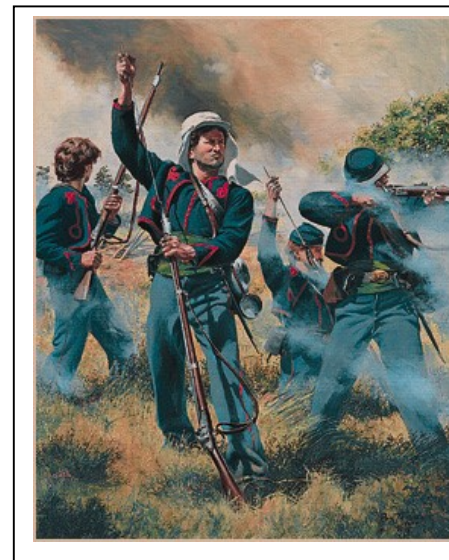
A. Wilson Greene is completing a three volume study of the Petersburg campaign.
